READ - Proverbs 7:1-27 together

* NOTE - this text is a parable that was written by King Solomon to his son. Apply it to your own personal context. Think of the "prostitute" as any form of sexual immorality or temptation: pornography, adultery, premarital sex, etc...

- 1) What jumps out to you in this passage? What is interesting, challenging, or something you've never noticed before?
- 2) Why do you think the Bible makes such a big deal about wisdom? What is wisdom?
- 3) How did the seductive woman get the young man to fall into sexual temptation? What were the four steps? (or maybe you see more)
- 4) What about the husband being gone for a long time makes the temptation so much more powerful? How does that apply to the forms of temptation we face today?
- 5) What would have been the best way for the young man to avoid falling into this trap of temptation?
- 6) What do we learn about sin from this passage?
- 7) What do we learn about our hearts from this passage?
- 8) What are the parallels between this passage and adultery, pornography, or pre-marital sex in our culture?
- 9) What are some specific things we can do or boundaries we can put into place that will prevent us falling into this snare?

- 2) What sexual temptation boundaries do you need to put into your life ASAP and you want this group to hold you accountable to?
