GROWING CLOSER TOGETHER

MESSAGE REFLECTION: Read together Matthew 16:13-20, 21-26

- 1) What is something from the sermon that stood out to you, convicted you, or encouraged you?
- 2) Why is the question "Who is Jesus?" the ultimate question that everyone must answer?
- 3) What is the difference between happiness and joy? Why should you cultivate joy in your life instead of happiness?
- 4) What does Jesus mean when he says that to follow him you must "take up your cross?" What should that look like in your life?
- 5) What are some reasons that "denying yourself" can be difficult?
- 6) How does Jesus' call to follow him by dying differ from what our culture says the good life is all about?

GOING DEEPER

READ - Romans 6:11-14 together

- 1) What is something that jumps out to you from this passage?
- 2) How do people let sin reign in their bodies?
- 3) How does grace change things when it comes to the bondage of sin? What role does the law have in the process of becoming more like Christ (see Romans 7:7)?
- READ Galatians 5:16-26 together
 - 1) What is something that stands out to you from this passage?
 - 2) Compare the two lists Paul presents in verses 19-23. When we crucify the things in the first list, what is the corresponding fruit from the second list that grows?

LIVING IT OUT

Revisit the lists from Galatians 5:16-26. Identify sins listed here or others that you know you need to let die. Identify the specific fruit that you would like God to bring about in your life.

- When did I last speak to someone else about my faith?
- Do I pray about the money I spend?
- Do I get to bed on time and get up on time?
- Do I disobey God in anything?
- Do I insist upon doing something about which my conscience is uneasy?
- Am I defeated in any part of my life?
- Am I jealous, impure, critical, irritable, touchy or distrustful?
- How do I spend my spare time?

- Is there anyone whom I fear, dislike, disown, criticize, hold a resentment toward or disregard? If so, what am I doing about it?
