GROWING CLOSER TOGETHER

- 1) Which do you prefer paper or digital maps? Why?
- 2) Tell about a time you got lost.



- 1) Share something from the service/message that stood out to you, inspired you, or encouraged you.
- 2) Read **Proverbs 4:1-19** together. Does anything in particular jump out at you from this passage?
- 3) Do you think that most everyday people love and pursue wisdom? Why or why not? If not, what are most people seeking?
- 4) What is the difference between wisdom and knowledge? How have you seen this difference play out in your life?
- 5) What is one decision you've made in your life that has had a major impact in your life's trajectory?
- 6) Does making godly choices mean good things will result? (consider the story of Joseph from Genesis 37, 39-40)
- 7) Read **Proverbs 27:12** together. How does asking better questions show wisdom? Can something be legal and still unwise?
- 8) Why is being teachable such a difficult aspect of wisdom?
- 9) Share about an experience where surrounding yourself with the right people helped you make a wise choice.



READ - Proverbs 8:1-21, 32-36 together

- 1) What jumps out at you from these passages that is interesting or thought-provoking?
- 2) What picture is painted of wisdom in the first three verses of chapter 8? Have you seen examples of blatant wisdom in today's culture?
- 3) What is one way that wisdom is superior to material wealth and desires (vss 10-11)?
- 4) Wisdom acts righteously. Prudence filters out unrighteous things. How do they work together as shown in verses 12-13?
- 5) Why must wisdom be sought diligently (vs 17)? How do you do this practically?
- 6) What are the benefits of loving wisdom according to this passage?
- 7) What are the consequences of not seeking wisdom in your life?

- 1) Reach out to someone who could use some "right people" in their life and invite them to coffee or dinner.
- 2) What type of questions do you ask yourself when making decisions, big or small? Ask God to help you ask better questions in decision-making situations.
