## **GROWING CLOSER TOGETHER**

- 1) Share your first and middle names. If you know what they mean or their significance share with the group.
- 2) If you've ever wanted a different name than your given name, what was it? Why did you prefer that name?



## MESSAGE REFLECTION

- 1)Share about something from the passage, service or message that stood out to you, inspired you, or encouraged you.
- 2) Read Luke 5:1-8 & Matthew 16:13-18 together.
- 3) Have you ever been given a nickname or been called a name that stuck with you or became part of your identity? If you're willing, share about it with the group.
- 4) Share about when you were confronted with your identity as a sinner.
- 5) Why is performance-based identity so deceptive? How is it wrong?
- 6) Why is inner-based identity so deceptive? How is it wrong?
- 7) How is "who is Jesus" a more important question to ask yourself than "who am I?"
- 8) Why is receiving your identity from Christ superior?
- 9) What must happen in order for your identity to change from sinner to child of God? (read **John 3:16** & **John 3:3** together)



## READ 2 Corinthians 5:17-21 together.

- 1) What jumps out at you from this passage that is interesting or thought-provoking?
- 2) What does it mean to be "in Christ?"
- 3) How is it possible that you can be made into a new creation?
- 4) What does it mean that God reconciled us to himself through Christ?
- 5) What is your identity after being made into a new creation? What does it mean to be Christ's ambassador?
- 6) Share your response to verse 21 and the reality of God substituting our sin with his Son so we can become righteous.
