## MESSAGE REFLECTION

- 1) Share about something from the service or message that stood out to you, inspired you, or encouraged you.
- 2) Read **Matthew 24:42-51** & **Matthew 25:14-21** together. What jumps out at you from these passages?
- 3) Why does modern culture embrace an "instant results, cancel anytime" mindset? What is the sin behind this mindset?
- 4) Why does becoming a mature Christian take so long? Have you ever felt impatient with the process of becoming more like Jesus? If applicable, share about it.
- 5) What is one way you can be faithful with what God has entrusted you with?
- 6) Read **2 Timothy 4:7** together. Why is it vital to remain faithful in the journey of following Jesus?
- 7) Where do you find the strength & source for remaining faithful? (see 2 Timothy 2:11-13 & 1 Thessalonians 5:24)



## READ Psalm 40:10-11 & Lamentations 3:22-23 together

- 1) What jumps out at you from these passages that is interesting or thought-provoking?
- 2) Identify the eight positive descriptions of God and his actions as found in Psalm 40:10-11.
- 3) Why does David repetitively remind the reader of God's faithfulness in verses 10 & 11?
- 4) According to Lamentations 3:22-23, what sustains God's people?
- 5) What is encouraging about knowing that God's compassion/love is new each morning?
- 6) Share about a time that you have witnessed God's GREAT faithfulness in your life.



- 1) What is one area of your life that you are thriving at being faithful? Praise God for his help. Identify one area of your life that needs more consistency/faithfulness. Ask our faithful God to help you.
- 2) Memorize Lamentations 3:22-23 this week and meditate on God's faithfulness in your life.
