## SERMON DISCUSSION GUIDE

April 26, 2026 | One Generation – Week 2



### GROWING CLOSER TOGETHER \_\_\_\_\_

1. What is something you learned from your parents or grandparents that has stuck with you?
2. If you could pass down one value or habit to the next generation, what would it be?



### MESSAGE REFLECTION \_\_\_\_\_

1. Share something from the service or message that stood out, challenged or encouraged you.
2. Where do you see the tension of “my will vs God’s will” in your own life?
3. What makes surrendering to God’s will so difficult in real life?
4. Why can success sometimes be more dangerous to our spiritual lives than failure?
5. In what ways can pride quietly shape your decisions without you realizing it?
6. Where do you see the principle of “what we tolerate now becomes normal later” playing out in culture or in your own life?
7. What are some practical reasons faith doesn’t get passed on within families or churches?
8. Share about who has had the biggest spiritual influence on your life and how you’ve been impacted by them.



## GOING DEEPER

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READ **Judges 2:6-12**.

1. What is something that jumps out at you from this passage?
2. What patterns do you notice between one generation and the next?
3. Why do you think the next generation “did not know the Lord” despite what had been done before them?
4. What does this passage reveal about the importance of intentional discipleship?
5. What role do relationships (family, mentors, church community) play in helping faith stick across generations?
6. Where do you feel the most responsibility in these areas?

READ **Psalms 78:4-7**.

7. What responsibility is described in this passage?
8. What does it look like practically to “tell the next generation” about God’s works today?



## YOUR NEXT STEP

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1. What is one way you can invest spiritually in the next generation this week?
2. Where might compromise or passivity in your life impact the next generation?
